Programme Requirements for Bachelor of Social Sciences with Honours in Global and China Studies (BSSCHGCSJ)

To be eligible for the award of the **Bachelor of Social Sciences with Honours in Global and China Studies**, a student shall obtain the required number of credits specified below for the Year of entry, in courses prescribed and detailed on the programme tables.

For students admitted via Year 1 entry in or after 2021/22, via Year 2 entry in or after 2022/23 and via Year 3 entry in or after 2023/24, they must complete the four University Core Values Modules, namely Core Value I (Integrity), Core Value II (Fairness), Core Value III (Perseverance), and Core Value IV (Innovation) for graduation.

Year 1 Entry

A student admitted to the programme through Year 1 Entry needs to complete a total of 160 credits and of which no more than 40 credits should be taken at Foundation Level. A student is required to complete:

1. 15 credits of Social Sciences Foundation Level courses in Table 1;
2. 5 credits of course in Table 2;
3. 10 credits of courses in Table 3;
4. 25 credits of courses in Table 4;
5. 20 credits of courses in Table 5;
6. 10 credits of courses in Table 6;
7. 10 credits of courses in Table 7;
8. 10 credits of courses in Table 8;
9. 10 credits of courses in Table 9;
10. 5 credits of courses in Table 10;
11. 10 credits of Higher Level courses labelled SH or HH (except those courses taken from the above) from Table 11;
12. 10 credits of English Language Enhancement courses*; and

13. 20 credits of purpose-designed General Education courses #.

Year 2 Entry

A student admitted to the programme through Year 2 Entry needs to complete a total of 120 credits and of which no more than 20 credits should be taken at Foundation Level. A student is required to complete:

1. 10 credits of courses in Table 3;
2. 25 credits of courses in Table 4;
3. 20 credits of courses in Table 5;
4. 10 credits of courses in Table 6;
5. 10 credits of courses in Table 7;
6. 10 credits of courses in Table 8;
7. 10 credits of courses in Table 9;
8. 5 credits of courses in Table 10;
9. 10 credits of Higher Level courses labelled SH or HH (except those courses taken from the above) from Table 11; and
10. 10 credits of English Language Enhancement courses*;

Year 3 Entry

A student admitted to the programme through Year 3 Entry needs to complete a total of 80 credits. A student is required to complete:

1. 20 credits of courses in Table 5;
2. 10 credits of courses in Table 6;
3. 10 credits of courses in Table 7;
4. 10 credits of courses in Table 8;
5. 10 credits of courses in Table 9;
6. 5 credits of courses in Table 10; and
7. 15 credits of Higher Level courses labelled SH or HH (except those courses taken from the above) from Table 11.

- (2) Group (b) courses:

- (a) For Year 1 and Year 2 Entry, group (b) courses consist of 25 credits from ECON A212F, ECON A232F, GCST A214F, POLS A221F and SOCIA221F, and 15 credits from Higher Level courses listed in paragraph (1) above (where such credits have not been taken into account for calculation in Group (a) courses) and other Middle or Higher Level courses labelled SM, SR, SH or HH in Tables 3 to 10.
- (b) For Year 3 Entry, group (b) courses consist of 40 credits from Higher Level courses listed in paragraph (1) above (where such credits have not been taken into account for calculation in Group (a) courses) and other Higher Level courses labelled SH or HH in Tables 4 to 10.

- (3) The weight for the calculation of WGPA for Group (a) courses is 1.5.
