

Programme Requirements for Bachelor of Social Sciences with Honours in Psychology

This 3-credit-unit system programme requirements document is applicable to the following student cohorts:

<i>Year of Entry</i>	<i>Admission cohort</i>
Year 1	2023/24 and thereafter
Year 2	2024/25 and thereafter
Year 3	2025/26 and thereafter

Students admitted to the Bachelor of Social Sciences with Honours in Psychology programme are required to declare the stream they wish to pursue at the time prescribed by the University. The two available streams are:

- Stream I – Psychology Major
- Stream II - Counselling Psychology

The programme requirements for the Stream I (Psychology Major) are listed in paragraphs 1 to 3 (Psychology Major) and Stream II (Counselling Psychology) in paragraphs 4 to 6.

Stream I – Psychology Major

1. Programme Requirement – Year 1 Entry

1.1 To be eligible for the award of the degree of Bachelor of Social Sciences with Honours in Psychology through Year 1 Entry, a student shall:

- 1.1.1 obtain 120 credit-units as prescribed below, of which no more than 30 credit-units shall be at 1000-level, at least 24 credit-units shall be at 3000-level and at least 24 credit-units shall be at 4000-level:
 - 1.1.1.1 51 credit-units of core courses applicable to Year 1 entry as listed in Table 1;
 - 1.1.1.2 24 credit-units of major elective courses in specific area from Table 2;
 - 1.1.1.3 24 credit-units of elective courses in specific area applicable to Year 1 entry as listed in Table 3;
 - 1.1.1.4 9 credit-units of University Core courses from Table 4;
 - 1.1.1.5 6 credit-units of University English courses from Table 5;
 - 1.1.1.6 6 credit-units of General Education (GE) courses (see www.hkmu.edu.hk/FT_GE for the updated list of GE courses)

and

1.1.2 attain the CGPA for graduation as prescribed in the Regulations for the award of undergraduate degrees.

2. Programme Requirement – Year 2 Entry

2.1 To be eligible for the award of the degree of Bachelor of Social Sciences with Honours in Psychology through Year 2 Entry, a student shall:

2.1.1 obtain 93 credit-units as prescribed below, of which at least 24 credit-units shall be at 3000-level and at least 24 credit-units shall be at 4000-level:

2.1.1.1 39 credit-units of core courses applicable to Year 2 entry as listed in Table 1;

2.1.1.2 24 credit-units of major elective courses in specific area from Table 2;

2.1.1.3 21 credit-units of elective courses in specific area applicable to Year 2 entry as listed from Table 3;

2.1.1.4 9 credit-units of University Core courses from Table 4;

and

2.1.2 attain the CGPA for graduation as prescribed in the Regulations for the award of undergraduate degrees.

3. Programme Requirement – Year 3 Entry

3.1 To be eligible for the award of the degree of Bachelor of Social Sciences with Honours in Psychology through Year 3 Entry, a student shall:

3.1.1 obtain 66 credit-units as prescribed below, of which at least 24 credit-units shall be at 3000-level and at least 24 credit-units shall be at 4000-level:

3.1.1.1 33 credit-units of core courses applicable to Year 3 entry as listed in Table 1;

3.1.1.2 21 credit-units of major elective courses in specific area from Table 2;

3.1.1.3 3 credit-units of at 3000-/4000-level elective courses in specific area applicable to Year 3 entry as listed in Table 3;

3.1.1.4 9 credit-units of University Core courses from Table 4;

and

3.1.2 attain the CGPA for graduation as prescribed in the Regulations for the award of undergraduate degrees.

4.1.1 obtain 120 credit-units as prescribed below, of which no more than 30 credit-units shall be at 1000-level, at least 24 credit-units shall be at 3000-level and at least 24 credit-units shall be at 4000-level:

4.1.1.1 78 credit-units of core courses applicable to Year 1 entry as listed in Table 6;

4.1.1.2 12 credit-units of major elective courses in specific area from Table 7;

4.1.1.3 9 credit-units of elective courses in specific area applicable to Year 1 entry as listed in Table 8;

4.1.1.4 9 credit-units of University Core courses from Table 9;

4.1.1.5 6 credit-units of University English courses from Table 10;

4.1.1.6 6 credit-units of General Education (GE) courses (see www.hkmu.edu.hk/FT_GE for the updated list of GE courses)

and

4.1.2 attain the CGPA for graduation as prescribed in the Regulations for the award of undergraduate degrees.

5. Programme Requirement – Year 2 Entry

5.1 To be eligible for the award of the degree of Bachelor of Social Sciences with Honours in Psychology through Year 2 Entry, a student shall:

5.1.1 obtain 93 credit-units as prescribed below, of which at least 24 credit-units shall be at 3000-level and at least 24 credit-units shall be at 4000-level:

5.1.1.1 63 credit-units of core courses applicable to Year 2 entry as listed in Table 6;

5.1.1.2 12 credit-units of major elective courses in specific area from Table 7;

5.1.1.3 9 credit-units of elective courses in specific area applicable to Year 2 entry as listed in Table 8;

5.1.1.4 9 credit-units of University Core courses from Table 9;

and

5.1.2 attain the CGPA for graduation as prescribed in the Regulations for the award of undergraduate degrees.

6. Programme Requirement – Year 3 Entry

6.1 To be eligible for the award of the degree of Bachelor of Social Sciences with Honours in Psychology through Year 3 Entry, a student shall:

6.1.1 obtain 66 credit-units as prescribed below, of which at least 24 credit-units shall be at 3000-level and at least 24 credit-units shall be at 4000-level:

6.1.1.1 39 credit-units of core courses applicable to Year 3 entry as listed in Table 6;

6.1.1.2 12 credit-units of major elective courses in specific area from Table 7;

6.1.1.3 6 credit-units of at 3000-level elective courses in specific area applicable to Year 3 entry as listed in Table 8;

6.1.1.4 9 credit-units of University Core courses from Table 9;

and

6.1.2 attain the CGPA for graduation as prescribed in the Regulations for the award of undergraduate degrees.
