

Regulations for the Master of Science in Chinese Environmental Studies

1. General

- 1.1 These regulations are made under paragraphs 1 to 4 of the Regulations for the Award of Postgraduate Degrees.
- 1.2 In these regulations, definitions shall apply as in the Regulations for the Award of Postgraduate Degrees and in the Interpretation section of the Academic Rules and Regulations.
- 1.3 A student shall complete the **Master of Science in Chinese Environmental Studies** within six years of first enrolling in the programme. Normal study durations are one year for full-time study or two years for part-time study.

2. Entry Requirements

- 2.1 To enter the **Master of Science in Chinese Environmental Studies** programme, a student shall normally possess:
 - 2.1.1 a recognized Bachelor's degree, or equivalent; or
 - 2.1.2 a recognized post-secondary qualification at Qualifications Framework Level 4 (or its equivalent), plus at least ten years of relevant work experience.

3. Master of Science in Chinese Environmental Studies

- 3.1 To be eligible for the award of the **Master of Science in Chinese Environmental Studies**, a student shall:
 - 3.1.1 comply with the Regulations for Admission, Registration and Maintenance of Status; and
 - 3.1.2 comply with the Regulations for the Award of Postgraduate Degrees; and
 - 3.1.3 obtain at least 60 credits in courses at Postgraduate level prescribed by the regulations.
- 3.2 For the **Master of Science in Chinese Environmental Studies**, the University has prescribed that a student must:
 - 3.2.1 successfully complete 60 credits from courses labelled CM in Table 1.
