Regulations for the Higher Diploma in Economics and Diploma in Economics

The programmes of Diploma in Economics and Higher Diploma in Economics will be phased out with effect from 2021 Autumn term. The last conferment of the above programmes will be 2024 Autumn term and 2025 Autumn term respectively.

These regulations are made under paragraphs 1 to 4 of the Regulations for the Award of Sub-degree Qualifications (Sub-degrees).

In these regulations, definitions shall apply as in the Regulations for the Award of Sub-degree Qualifications and in the Interpretation section of the Academic Rules and Regulations.

Higher Diploma in Economics (HDEC)

- 1. To be eligible for the award of the **Higher Diploma in Economics**, a student shall:
 - a) comply with the Regulations for Admission, Registration and Maintenance of Status; and
 - b) comply with the Regulations for the Award of Sub-degree Qualifications (Sub-degrees); and
 - c) obtain at least 90 credits* in courses prescribed by the regulations including at least 10 credits at Higher level.
 - * Of the 90 credits required for the attainment of the Higher Diploma, students can complete up to 30 credits of courses in a language of instruction other than English.
- 2. For the **Higher Diploma in Economics**, the University has prescribed that a student must:
 - a) obtain at least 5 credits from courses labelled SF in Table 1; and
 - b) obtain 30 credits from courses labelled SC and MF in Table 1; i.e.
 - (i) 10 credits from both ECON A231/ECON A231C and ECON A232/ECON A232C; and
 - (ii) 10 credits from MATH S122 or BUS B273; and
 - (iii) 10 credits from both ECON A311 and ECON A312; and
 - c) obtain 40 credits from courses labelled PF, SM and SH in Table 1 other than those taken in fulfilment of (b) above; and
 - d) complete additional courses labelled SF, PF, BM*, SM and SH in Table 1 to obtain the total of 90 credits required for the award.

Diploma in Economics (DEC)

- 1. To be eligible for the award of the **Diploma in Economics**, a student shall:
 - a) comply with the Regulations for Admission, Registration and Maintenance of Status; and
 - b) comply with the Regulations for the Award of Sub-degree Qualifications (Sub-degrees); and
 - c) obtain at least 60 credits in courses prescribed by the regulations including at least 20 credits at Middle level.

^{*} Students who have successfully completed FIN B382/FIN B400 are deemed to have satisfied the requirements of FIN B280 and a 5-credit course labelled BM.

- 2. For the **Diploma in Economics**, the University has prescribed that a student must:
 - a) obtain at least 5 credits from courses labelled SF and MF in Table 1; and
 - b) obtain 10 credits from courses labelled SC in Table 1; i.e. 10 credits from both ECON A231/ECON A231C and ECON A232/ECON A232C; and
 - c) obtain 30 credits from courses labelled PF, SM and SH in Table 1; and
 - d) complete additional courses labelled SF, MF, PF, BM*, SM and SH in Table 1 to obtain the total of 60 credits** required for the award.
